School & Community

Founded in 1972, AISD is a non-profit co-educational day school, sponsored by the United States Embassy, that offers a comprehensive Pre-Kindergarten to Grade 12 American-style university preparatory program. The parents of our students typically are professionals serving with various embassies, United Nations departments, non-governmental organizations, multinational companies, and service agencies. About 15% are resident Bangladeshi nationals. English is the medium of instruction, with English as an Additional Language (EAL) classes available throughout. The International Baccalaureate Diploma (DP) and Primary Years (PYP) programs were introduced in 2006 and 2008 respectively.

Enrollment

AISD is comprised of a diverse student population that numbers 434 students total and 136 in grades 9-12. Forty-two nationalities are represented in the entire school with 34 of those nationalities present in the high school.

Faculty

The AISD faculty and administration is comprised of 83 members with 60 U.S. citizens and 23 citizens of other countries from the continents of Asia, Australia, Europe, North America, and South America.

The AISD high school faculty consists of a Principal, Vice Principal, an IB Diploma Coordinator, Athletic Director, School Librarian, Counselor, and 28 teachers.

Curriculum

The High School curriculum offers a broad range of course offerings, which enable students to pursue further education in the United States, Canada, Europe and institutions around the world. In grades 11 & 12, students may opt to pursue the International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma or IB Certificates in various courses, in addition to earning the AISD High School Diploma.

Graduation/Diploma Requirements

All high school students enrolled at AISD are expected to earn the AISD high school diploma, awarded upon completion of specific course and other requirements accomplished between Grade 9 and 12. Generally, one half credit is issued per semester in which a passing mark is achieved. To earn the diploma, a minimum of 27 credits is needed as per the following subject distribution.

Athletics and Co-Curriculars

Sports competitions and fine arts festivals have always been an important part of learning and growing at AISD. Each year students are given the opportunity to participate in numerous sports and academic events including badminton, basketball, cricket, fine art, mathematics, music, soccer, swimming, tennis, theatre, track & field and volleyball.

AISD participates in two sports and academic leagues. SAISA (South Asia Inter-School Association) includes ten international schools in the Indian subcontinent region from the countries of Bangladesh, India, Nepal, Oman, Pakistan and Sri Lanka. DISA (Dhaka International Schools Association) is the local sports league and is comprised of twelve international schools in Dhaka, in addition to a few partner schools. Regular season games and tournaments are conducted each season.

AISD offers several clubs for high school students which include the following: Global Issues Network, Habitat for Humanity, Peer Facilitators, Model United Nations, C-Squared Media Club, National Honor Society, South Asian Club.

Service Learning

Service Learning is an essential part of the AISD High School experience and is a requirement to earn an AISD Diploma. The High School currently supports eleven different organizations in and around Dhaka. All High School students participate in the various projects and special "Service Learning Days" are scheduled twice a year for on-site, hands-on work to be completed.
